



## CAHIO FACT SHEET

The California Association of Health Insuring Organizations (CAHIO) is comprised of the six public, non-profit, County Organized Health Systems (COHS) plans. As of July 2011, COHS plans will operate in fourteen counties serving nearly 1,000,000 Medi-Cal Managed Care enrollees. COHS plans serve nearly all Medicaid beneficiaries in their counties including:

- Beneficiaries with both Medicare and Medicaid coverage (i.e., dual eligibles)
- Seniors and Persons with Disabilities
- Long term care residents, including those in Skilled Nursing Facilities
- Individuals requiring organ transplants
- Individuals who have a Share of Cost

COHS plans are well-regarded in their communities and include the following attributes:

### Access

- COHS plans have expanded access to services, linked members to medical homes and ensured necessary medical care for members.

### Quality

- COHS plans are consistently recognized by the Department of Health Care Services as top performers in Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set measures.

### Efficient

- COHS plans' administrative budgets are among the lowest as reported by the Department of Managed Health Care.
- COHS plans save the tax payers millions of dollars over the State Fee-for-Service program.

### Programs

- Healthy Families All COHS plans participate in the Healthy Families program serving nearly 75,000 Healthy Families children. In recognition of their partnership with local safety net providers, COHS plans have earned the Community Provider Plan designation in each of the counties in which they operate.
- Healthy Kids All COHS plans partner with local Children's Health Initiatives within their communities to offer Healthy Kids programs.
- Medicare Advantage Special Needs Plans (MA SNPs) Three COHS plans offer Medicare MA SNPs.
- In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Three COHS plans have partnered with local County Public Authority to provide health care coverage to IHSS Caregivers.
- Access for Infants and Mothers (AIM) Two COHS plans contract with the Managed Risk Medical Insurance Board to offer the AIM program.
- Integration COHS plans are developing programs to integrate services including long term care, California Children's Services and behavioral health.
